Construction Coordinator

As the head of the construction crew, the Construction Coordinator oversees the process of building any necessary sets or stages for a production. Managing a team of Carpenters, Painters, Plasterers, and Construction Workers, the Construction Coordinator ensures the Production Designer's sets are built on time, within budget, and safely. Hired early on in the pre-production process, the Construction Coordinator puts together his or her team of craftspeople and labourers after receiving the Production Designer's plans. From there, they order materials, schedule work, and oversee everything from initial planning to the last coat of paint.

- 1. Collaborates with the Production Designer and the Art Department on all aspects of construction build, providing guidance to evaluate the stability of any structure based on preliminary drawings.
- **2.** Creates a clear construction budget breakdown and a working schedule for set build.
- **3.** Scouts during prep: Advice to the Production Designer and Location Manager on the limitations of works on location.
- **4.** Hires crew and formulates HOD team: Assembles the best team of craft personnel to implement the Production Designer's vision.
- **5.** Develops construction breakdown.
- 6. Construction set-up.
- **7.** Supervises the work of the construction team.
- **8.** Day-to-day crew management.

Task statements

Task statement 1:

Pre-prep dialogue with Producers, Production Manager and Designer.

Associated activities

- Advises during pre-prep using a wealth of experience.
- Has productive dialogue with Producer/PM/production company and Designer to make recommendations and discuss projects at hand.
- Discusses start dates with production, and establishes size of crew, duration of job and length of prep.
- ✓ All the above will vary largely depending on whether the production is episodic, a feature or a pilot.

Task statement 2:

Develops budget and time frame.

Associated activities

- Receives script breakdown from Designer in order to formulate budget.
- ✓ Assesses requirements for the sets, taking into consideration the period and time frame.
- Meets with Producers to assess feasibility of the budget and makes recommendations and achieves compromises where necessary and to reach an agreed plan.
- Completes rough budgeting.

Task statement 3:

Scouting during prep.

Associated activities

- Attends location scouting.
- Searches for a studio facility and unit base when necessary.
- Discusses options for locations when necessary.

Task statement 4:

Hiring crew and formulating HOD team.

- Schedules, manages, and coordinates camera, make-up, hair, costume, design, SFX and/or VFX tests. Understands Director and Producer roles and priorities as well as their personal preferences.
- Communicates the Director's wishes within the limitations of the production scale with continuous amendment of the schedule to reflect the same.

Task statement 5:

Develops construction breakdown.

Associated activities

- Receives working drawings/Information (per drawing Time/Cost/Manpower) from Art Department and work flow chart (how money will be spent) to begin the process.
- A good working knowledge of the locations where filming will take place is imperative.

Task statement 6:

Construction set-up.

Associated activities

- Coordinates and supervises the set up of workshops for each grade.
- Ensures there are acceptable facilities (ie: canteen).
- Ensures H&S standards are met.

Task statement 7:

Supervises the work of the construction team.

Associated activities

- Delegates the work to relevant HODs, ensuring materials and equipment are at their disposal.
- Supervises the construction of sets.
- Deals with changes and challenges task by task until completion.
- Ensures deadlines are being hit.
- Discusses budget variances where things need to be cut or added.
- Responsible for sourcing all rigging materials, and for ensuring that they are supplied on time and at the agreed price.
- Ensures that labour and material costs are kept within agreed parameters.
- Trouble shoots on set issues.

Task statement 8:

Day-to day crew management.

- Hires additional crew when necessary.
- Receives reports from HODs and ensures the department is running smoothly.
- "What do you need to do your job?" discuss obstacles/weather, facilities, work space, equipment.
- ✓ Liaises with other departments and has strong working knowledge of who is who and what is what.
- Oversees and monitors the wellbeing of the crew.

Construction Manager

Construction Managers look after the building of sets. They make sure that sets look as realistic or otherwise as desired. They interpret the drawings of the Production Designer, Art Directors and draughtspersons and work out how to build them in ways that are safe and environmentally friendly. They then hire the workforce, the Carpenters, Painters, Riggers and Plasterers, and ensure everyone knows what needs to be done and by when. They are responsible for getting the necessary materials and tools on site and for the safety of the crew working with machines and at heights. Construction Managers are responsible for dismantling the sets, known as 'striking' the set, and ensuring all the materials are recycled as far as possible, or put into storage.

*On productions where the budget permits and the requirements dictate it, a Construction Supervisor/Assistant Construction Manager may also be employed.

- Assesses location feasibility: access etc.
- Sets up temporary workshops/H&S, welfare facilities, access etc.

Task statement 4:

Hires crew and puts together the key team.

- Talks with HODs begin to hiring of key crew.
- Has productive dialogue with core crew to check availability.
- Once the HODs are in place, the other grades are brought on board touches base with the previous crew.
- ✓ HR management conflict management.
- Crew management and recruiting is an ongoing part of the job.

Task statement 5:

Develops construction breakdown.

Associated activities

- Receives working drawings/Information (drawing Time/Cost/Manpower) from Art Department and work flow chart (how money will be spent).
- Inputs info into the workflow chart.
- Creates breakdown drawings, deconstructions of Art Department drawings and translates them into the Construction Department.
- Liaises with art dept on drawing details and information, making changes where necessary.
- Creates a work schedule which will determine the manpower and assigns crew to the various jobs keeping in line with deadlines.
- Having a good working knowledge of the locations where filming will take place is imperative.

Task statement 6:

Coordinates the setup of construction workshops and facilities.

Associated activities

- Coordinates and supervises the setup of workshops for each grade.
- Ensures there are acceptable facilities (canteen, W/Cs, hygiene facilities etc.).
- Ensures H&S standards are met.
- Organises the transportation and installation of necessary equipment and materials.
- Has a wealth of knowledge of supply chains and vendors.
- Liaises with Locations and Production Departments.

Task statement 7:

Supervises the work of the construction team.

Associated activities

- Delegates the work to relevant HODs, ensuring materials and equipment are at their disposal.
- Supervises the construction of sets.
- Deals with changes and challenges task by task until completion.
- Ensures deadlines are being hit.
- Discusses budget variances where things need to be cut or added.
- Trouble shoots any problem.

Task statement 8:

Manages the day to day workflow of the construction team.

- Requests additional crew when necessary: liaises with coordinator and production.
- Requests overtime, when necessary, PM or Coordinator if on job.
- Receives reports from HODs and ensures the department is running smoothly and carries out routine checks.
- Asks the question "What do you need to do your job?" discuss obstacles/weather, facilities, workspace etc.
- Liaises with other departments and has strong working knowledge of who is who and what is what.
- Oversees and monitors the wellbeing of the crew.
- On-going problem solving.

HOD Carpenter

The Production Carpenter is responsible for building, installing, and removing wooden structures on the film set and on location. They are one of several members of the construction team that work together to carry out the design and creative vision of the Producer and the Director under the Art Department. Production carpenters must be highly skilled at their craft and should possess the ability to visualize structures and props in advance of the production.

Production Carpenters have strong working knowledge of carpentry and the ability to creatively see-through film set production in a timely manner. They must build and take down sets on deadline, often working under immense pressure to complete projects on schedule.

- **1.** Collaborates and works closely with the Construction Supervisor and Art Department.
- 2. Proficient at reading scale drawings and breaking down various carpentry elements within the drawings.
- **3.** Ensures work is carried out, assigning components of the various builds to the team of carpenters
- **4.** Develops a good working relationship with other departments.
- **5.** Ensures there is sufficient stock of materials on site to ensure the build continues without interruption.

Task statements

Task statement 1:

Collaborates and works closely with the Construction Supervisor and Art Department.

Associated activities

- Acquires drawings and time frames.
- Breaks down and assesses drawings.
- Delegates jobs to the team to ensure all areas are covered.
- Obtains all necessary info from the Construction Supervisor, and when necessary, goes straight to the Art Department.
- Liaises between the Construction Manager and the Art Department with samples such as aging timbers.

Task statement 2:

Proficient at reading scale drawings and breaking down various carpentry elements within the drawings.

Associated activities

- ✓ Understands and visualizes the end part of complex drawings and uses strong math skills to appropriately develop sets to scale.
- Reads diagrams understands plans, and follows instructions.
- Imagines ways of creating a structure from a plan and finds solutions to technical challenges.
- Measuring: takes measurements and does calculations.

Task statement 3:

Ensures work is carried out, assigning components of the various builds to the team of carpenters.

- Carries out all work to the deadline according to schedule.
- When necessary, comes into the production in the pre-production phase to ensure that the location is set and ready in advance of the shoot.
- Helps to strike or dismantle and removes all wooden structures when necessary.
- Understands the properties of wood and other materials.
- Is comfortable with power tools, hand saws, hammers, nails and knives.

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Task statement 4:

Develops a good working relationship with other departments.

Associated activities

- ✓ Develops and maintains positive working relations with Riggers, Electricians, Props amongst others.
- Communicate with them when necessary, to discuss overlapping features such as scotching timber or building structures.
- ✓ Has prior working knowledge of what their job entails.

Task statement 5:

Ensures there is sufficient stock of materials on site to ensure the build continues without interruption.

- ✓ Informs Manager or Coordinator when materials need to be ordered and stock is running low.
- Keeps tabs on materials as they are being used.

HOD Painter

The Master Painter supervises and manages the painting crew. They are responsible for bringing to life several elements of set design, paint fixtures and textures on sets as a key member of the creative team. They must collaborate closely with the Production Designer and Art Department, interpreting, visualizing, and creating looks suitable for a film environment. They must break down the script in pre-production, to give a detailed interpretation of what is required for various scenes. They must work to brief, preparing, painting and aging the set and scenery, age distress sets, scenery and props, and painting backdrops and signage. They must replicate interior and exterior locations from existing or historical sources. They must assign and create a working schedule and quantify the scale of crew needed. They must assemble a team of high-quality crafts people who work well together.

- **1.** Collaborates and works closely with the Production Designer and the Art Department regarding paint finishes and textures.
- 2. Develops a good working relationship with other departments.
- **3.** Visualises and creates the look required by the Production Designer in a short period of time.
- **4.** Creates an inventory of materials to achieve the paint finish and timeline for delivery of products based on schedule
- **5.** Assembles the best team of crafts members to implement the Production Designer's vision under your supervision
- **6.** Works within the current Health & Safety Regulations ensuring the correct personal protective equipment is provided.

Task statements

Task statement 1:

Collaborates and works closely with the Production Designer and the Art Department regarding paint finishes and textures.

Associated activities

- ✓ Acquires drawings and time frames from the Art Department.
- ✓ Breaks down and assesses drawings to decipher what is needed.
- ✓ If the shoot is on location, carries out any necessary 'walk throughs'.
- Show and tell bring colour pallets and samples to the Designer and cross reference with Make-up and Costume to ensure colours do not clash.

Task statement 2:

- Develops and maintains positive working relations with Riggers, Electricians, Props, Plasterers, Model Makers and Special Effects amongst others.
- Ensures there is departmental cohesion.
- Communicates to discuss overlapping features such as scotching timber, building structures or camouflaging.
- Has a good working knowledge of each grade within the Construction Department.

Task statement 3:

Visualises and creates the look required by the Production Designer in a short period of time.

Associated activities

- Expert knowledge of painting and decorating skills.
- Produces bespoke pieces ie: sign writing, grain painting, marbling.
- ✓ Has a broad understanding of art finishes from different cultures, eras, and periods.

Task statement 4:

Creates an inventory of materials to achieve the paint finish and timeline for delivery of products based on schedule.

- Reads and interprets the schedule to decipher what may be needed, bearing in mind the constraints of budget.
- ✓ Makes a list of all necessary needed materials for the Manager/Coordinator
- ✓ Informs Manager/Coordinator when materials need to be ordered and re-stocked.
- Keeps tabs on materials as they are being used to ensure the department does not run out.

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Task statement 5:

Assembles the best team of crafts members to implement the Production Designer's vision under your supervision.

Associated activities

- Contacts and assembles the right team of Painters for the job, including the Stand-By Painter.
- ✓ Delegates jobs to the team to ensure all areas are covered.
- Carries out all work according to schedule.

Task statement 6:

Working within the current Health & Safety Regulations ensuring the correct personal protective equipment is provided.

- Attends any necessary training as provided by production: working with height machines and mobile working platforms.
- ✓ Provides a safe working environment for all personnel in workshops, studio builds and location work.

HOD Plasterer

The Master Plasterer supervises and manages the plastering crew. They must work with the art department and other construction crew, planning and creating all of the plaster work to be carried out by their team, including walls, ceiling and decorative work. They must interpret scale drawings and establish all finishes and moldings required. They must create realistic and effective props for plasterwork, fixing plasterwork on set and distressing and blending in the natural environment. They must assign and create a working schedule and quantify the scale of crew needed. They must assemble a team of high-quality crafts people who work well together. They must ensure there are enough materials available so as to not interrupt the workflow.

- **1.** Collaborates and works closely with the Art Department and other construction crew on all aspects of plaster finishes and mouldings required.
- **2.** Assembles the best team of craft personnel to implement the Art Department's vision.
- **3.** Reads the scale drawings and breaks down various plaster elements required for sets.
- **4.** Assigns components of the various builds to the team of plasterers.
- **5.** Ensures a safe working environment for both cast and crew on set and location.

Task statements

Task statement 1:

Collaborates and works closely with the Art Department and other construction crew on all aspects of plaster finishes and mouldings required.

Associated activities

- ✓ Acquires drawings and time frames from the Art Department.
- ✓ Breaks down and assesses drawings to decipher what is needed.
- ✓ Liaises with Art Department to discuss requirements for any bespoke pieces such as columns, stonework, arches, picture rails, moulds and panels.
- Attends recces when necessary and specific to the department.

Task statement 2:

Assembles the best team of craft personnel to implement the Art Department's vision.

Associated activities

- ✓ Liaises with the Construction Coordinator regarding crewing requirements and scale of manpower.
- Discusses who will be hired.
- ✓ Works out capabilities and applies talents to get the best out of each person.
- Carries out ongoing discussions about team performances.
- ✓ Manages timetables and HR issues in a timely and productive way.

Task statement 3:

Reads scale drawings and breaks down various plaster elements required for sets.

- Receives drawings in order to decipher the scale and materials required and make decisions based on experience.
- Keeps up to date with materials on the market and their uses.
- Bears in mind weather tolerance and adaptability when choosing materials.
- Ensures longevity and reduces maintenance whenever possible.

Task statement 4:

Assigns components of the various builds to the team of plasterers.

Associated activities

- Creates a schedule of works and appoints assistants.
- Quantifies scale of crew required.
- Decides who will work on which project based on each person's skills.
- ✓ Has a thorough knowledge of the strengths within the team.
- Constantly reviews the schedule ensuring sets are being turned around according to deadlines.
- Liaises with various other grades and departments: Carpenters, Painters, Props, Model Makers, Stunts, Special Effects

Task statement 5:

Ensures a safe working environment for both cast and crew on set and location.

- Is familiar with the current Health & Safety regulations and enforcing them throughout the project.
- Attends any necessary training as provided by production: working with height machines and mobile working platforms.
- Provides a safe working environment for all personnel in workshops, studio builds and location work.
- Meets the requirements of Health and Safety.
- Maintains clean and tidy work spaces.

HOD Rigger

Head of Department Riggers are in charge of the Rigging Department, and are hired by, and report to, Construction Managers. Rigger's work may range from building relatively small platforms, up to the construction of the main supporting structures of elaborate film sets. HOD Riggers are responsible for the work of the entire Rigging Department on films, which involves installing rigging gear such as scaffolding, cables, ropes, pulleys, winches and lifting equipment. HOD Riggers ensure that all work is completed to deadlines, and that it adheres to stringent Health and Safety standards. The role requires extensive rigging experience, and strong leadership skills.

*Within the Rigging Department there are also the following grades:

- Supervising Rigger
- Chargehand Rigger
- Stand-by Rigger

- Advises the production team and other relevant Heads of Department about what access is possible, and practical, onto rigs, taking into consideration the location and any potential hazards.
- Ascertains from Construction Managers and other Heads of Department all the project's rigging requirements, and the build schedule
- Communicates effectively with colleagues at all levels of the production, and with key crew such as Directors, Heads of Department, and First Assistant Directors.
- ✓ Attends recces when necessary and specific to the department.

Task statement 2:

Reads technical and digital drawings.

Associated activities

- Reads scale drawings and assesses rigging requirements.
- In collaboration with the Construction Manager, establishes the types of rigging required, e.g., they may need to build large blocks of scaffolds to hold street scene facades, or to create more intricate forms of stage rigging such as rolling rostrums to move large set pieces.

Task statement 3:

Calculates the stresses, strains and loads on structures.

Associated activities

- Installs lifting and suspension equipment, such as wire and fibre ropes, winches, pulley blocks, chains and slings as well as building and dismantling access and support scaffolding, and positions and removes specialized ladder equipment in order to access the rig.
- Calculates the stresses and loads of equipment on various structures.

Task statement 4:

Creates a schedule of works, appoints assistants and quantifies the scale of crew required.

- Coordinates the work of rigging teams on a number of different sound stages or on location builds.
- Ensures that the correct number of crew members work on a particular rig, and that the required materials arrive on time, at the right location.
- Ensures that the construction of the specific projects under their responsibility, progresses smoothly, and meets deadlines.
- Manages the building of scaffolding to support street scene facades, constructing a rostrum capable of taking heavy loads, or 'blacking out' a building to allow crews to shoot day for night.
- ✓ In consultation with the Construction Manager, appoints Supervising, Chargehand and/or Standby Riggers.

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Task statement 5:

Calculates the quantity of stock required to carry out tasks.

Associated activities

- In consultation with the Construction Manager, ensure there is sufficient stock of materials on site to ensure the build continues without interruption.
- ✓ Keeps accurate records of the labour and equipment used.

Task statement 6:

Health and Safety management.

- Ensures that all work is carried out according to the requirements of the relevant Health and Safety legislation, guidelines, and procedures.
- ✓ Has excellent Health and Safety knowledge and awareness and conducts risk assessments on set and on location.
- Ensures the safety of crew and cast.
- ✓ Passes on information and theory in a clear manner with regard to safe systems of work.

Carpenters, Painters & Plasterers

These grades carry out much of the day-to-day work for the Construction Department on a busy film/TV production, producing and finishing structures, props and scenery backdrops. They must collaborate to accomplish the project according to the creative vision of the Head of Department, Designer, and Director. They must carry out this work to a high standard according to the instruction and direction of the master craftspeople offering ideas and creative input. They must execute work according to drawings and other references as closely as possible. They must be versatile and work with other departments as required. They must follow Health and Safety regulations and enforce them throughout the build.

Stagehands

Stagehands support the other team members such as Carpenters, Plasterers, and Painters in a wide variety of tasks. They are responsible for good housekeeping on the building stages of sets and locations, ensuring safe working environments and keeping sets clear of debris. They must move equipment, operating lifting equipment as necessary. They must work as part of a large team and take instruction from HODs on what tasks are required on a given day. They must work to tight deadlines and the demands of a busy production. They must work to maintain Health and Safety standards. Must have a full, clean driver's license and transportation.
