1. Fís Éireann/Screen Ireland Operations

Fís Éireann/Screen Ireland staff in both the Dublin and Galway offices will work remotely until Monday, 29th March. With a business continuity plan in place, the agency expects day-to-day operations to continue as normal wherever possible.

2. Application Deadlines

All funding application deadlines currently still apply, and are as set out on the Screen Ireland website.

3. **Projects currently in Development or Production**

All normal procedures continue to apply in respect of payment of invoices. Normal documentation, as set out in your funding contract, should be provided to facilitate any payments which will be processed on a weekly basis as normal.

Payments and invoices outside of production and development funding will also be processed as normal.

4. Projects due to go into production in April or May

Please stay in contact with your assigned Project Manager. Projects are being reviewed and assessed on a case-by-case basis with our co-financiers.
