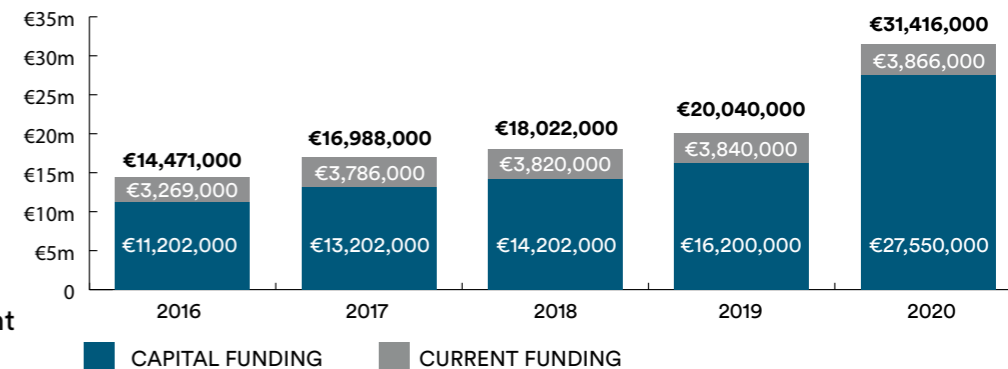

Funding 2020

Funding for Screen Ireland comes directly from the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media. In 2020 the total amount of funding was €31,416,000 which is broken down to €27,550,000 in Capital and €3,866,000 in Current (overhead) funding.

Funding over the last 5 years is broken down as follows:

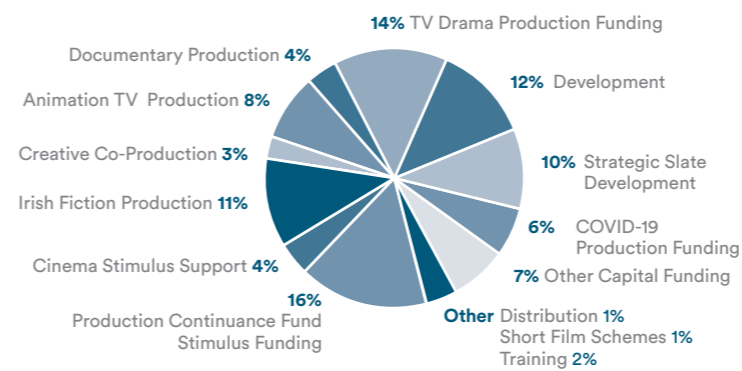


Screen Ireland Capital Funding

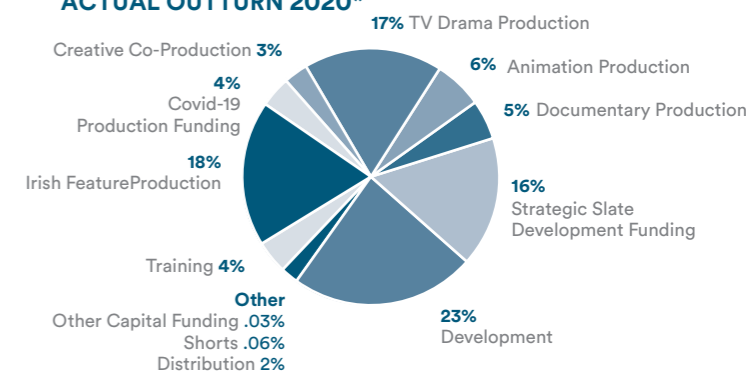
Screen Ireland allocates capital funding to project development, production, distribution, short films, training and industry support. The Capital budget is augmented by monies allocated from recouped

amounts. In 2020 the budget was **re-profiled** after the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic to account for the **set-down** of live action production. The following percentages were allocated as follows:

BUDGETED EXPENDITURE 2020



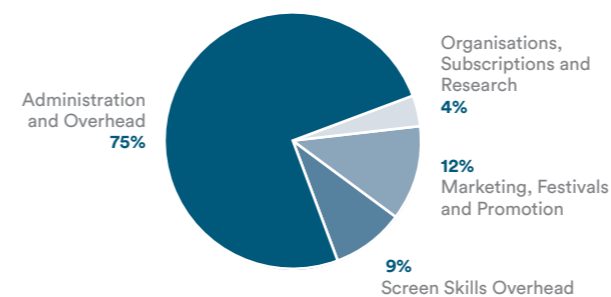
ACTUAL OUTTURN 2020*



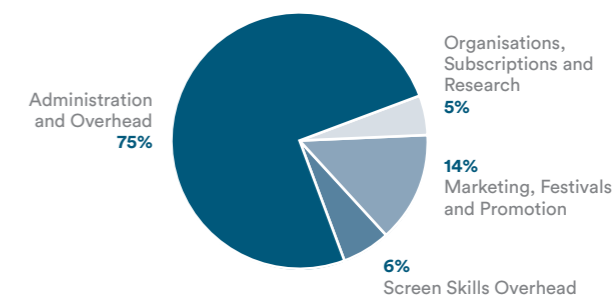

The aim of this scheme was to discover and develop diverse, fresh and exciting new screenwriting talent. Spotlight provided an opportunity for new writers to develop a feature film screenplay, with guidance and mentorship from leading industry figures, script editors and Screen Ireland's Production and Development team. Screen Ireland strongly encouraged applications from those with diverse voices and underrepresented backgrounds. The scheme achieved a gender balance with 53% of the selected projects written by female talent. Enhanced investment into the scheme as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic allowed 5 additional places to be created on the programme.

COVID-19 Supports

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Screen Ireland introduced practical measures designed to aid the industry to develop a strong slate of quality projects, so that the industry can emerge in a position to scale up production activity. Some of these measures included:

TV Drama Stimulus

In July, Minister for Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media Catherine Martin T.D committed to an additional €3 million in TV Drama funding, focused on increasing TV drama production activity and creating additional jobs in the sector. The stimulus funding stabilised an Irish spend of €20m+ in Irish production and secured a projected €6.34m in foreign direct investment. The funding was allocated as follows:

TV DRAMA (ADDITIONAL INVESTMENT)

€1,375,000

Additional investment in Screen Ireland TV Drama Productions, stimulating large-scale production activity across Irish TV drama. The funding had regional, diversity and gender equality objectives.

OTHER TV DRAMA INITIATIVES

A number of joint development initiatives across Comedy, Young People's drama programming, Irish language TV drama and a diverse range of short films with the leading Irish broadcasters including RTÉ, VMTV and TG4:

TALENT ACADEMY LIVE ACTION (GALWAY)

€600,000

Funding to focus on regional and diverse career growth, and to highlight Ireland as a centre of excellence in scripted drama production and in representing a diverse range of talent from all backgrounds in senior creative production roles, ensuring gender parity across the sector and an inclusive and evolving workforce.

Animation Stimulus

A further stimulus package of €1m for the animation sector was announced in 2020. This funding was designed to support international scale, encourage creative innovation through emerging tech and increased skill development to respond to the animation industry's continued growth.

ANIMATION ACADEMY

€600,000

The funding will focus on further talent growth within the sector. The agency is committed in its ambition to highlight Ireland as a centre of excellence in Animation and in representing a diverse range of talent from all backgrounds in creative production roles.

ANIMATION CONCEPT & CREATIVE INNOVATION DEVELOPMENT

€400,000

In collaboration with Animation Ireland, the funding will be invested in new innovative, high concept development and business growth opportunities within the Animation sector.

Building Back Audiences: the Cinema Stimulus Fund

€1,350,000

With the support of the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport & Media, Screen Ireland launched this scheme, a special initiative to support the exhibition sector in recovering from the severe impact of COVID-19 closures. The scheme received 28 Applications across 123 sites, 227 screens and 42,986 seats.

COVID-19 Supports continued

DIRECTOR'S CONCEPT

Screen Ireland and the Screen Directors Guild of Ireland collaborated on 'The Voice', a conceptual development fund for directors which will invest in the vision of the Director to develop high-value projects.

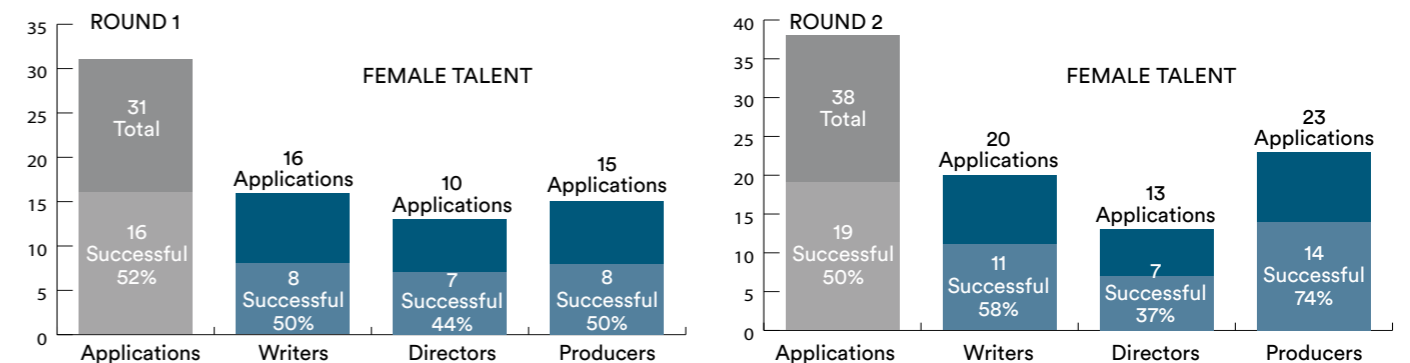
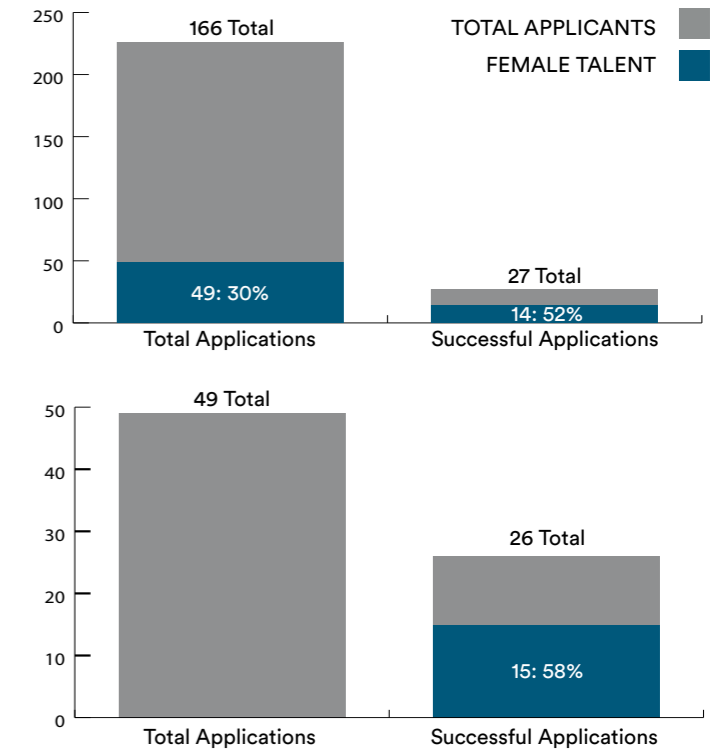
STRATEGIC SLATE FUNDING

Originally announced early in 2020, this Strategic Slate Development Fund was customised to respond to the challenges the global pandemic presents. It is one of several practical and effective funding measures introduced so that the industry can emerge from the current situation positioned to return to production activity with strong creative projects.

ENHANCED PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND

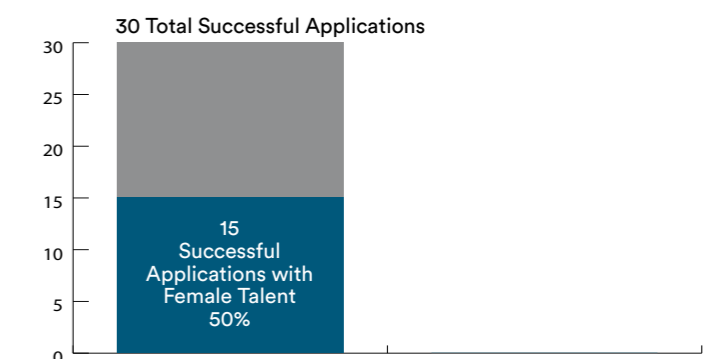
A one-off Enhanced Project Development Fund which aims to support the development of projects in the short term. This is a line of ring-fenced funding of up to €1 million to support ambitious, unique and diverse projects across all genres.

NORMAL PEOPLE

Produced by Element Pictures with financing from Screen Ireland, BBC, Hulu, and RTÉ, *Normal People* was the most-streamed series of the year on the BBC iPlayer, with 62.7 million views from April to November 2020. The series also garnered over 5 million views on the RTÉ Player, breaking the previous record. *Normal People* achieved widespread critical acclaim; a list of awards and nominations can be found on page 19.

THE SOUTH WESTERLIES

LIVE ACTION GENDER BREAKDOWN



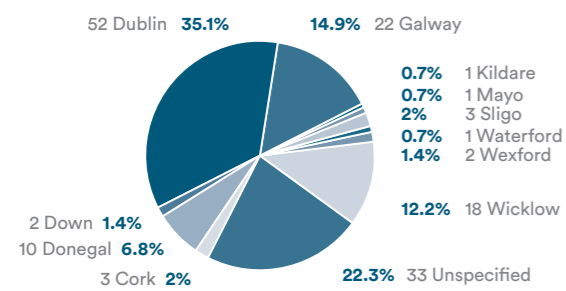
